NOVEMBER 23 SPEAKER—BILL BOYD



Wm. E. (Bill) Boyd, a member of the Rotary Club of McCormick County, is the Centennial District Governor for 2004-2005. He has been a Rotarian since 1975 and served as President of the Rotary Club of Washington, GA in 1989-90. He was selected Rotarian of the year for that club in 1991-92.

In 1996-97 Bill served as Charter President of the Rotary Club of McCormick County. He also served as club treasurer for four years and Foundation Chair for seven years. Bill has served as Lieutenant Governor for Area 9 and has been on the District 7750 GSE committee for four years, serving two years as chairman.

Bill has 19 years continuous perfect attendance. He is a multiple Paul Harris Fellow, a Rotary Benefactor, a Rotary Foundation Major Donor – Level 2, and a Bequest Society member. He received a Rotary Foundation District Service award in 1990-00 and is a Charter Member of the International Travel and Hosting Fellowship of Rotary.

Bill was born in Memphis, Michigan, but moved to Winter Haven, Florida, at an early age. He attended the University of Florida and received a Bachelor of Science degree in accounting.
