
Gate Captains Needed



According to Article 3 of the Bylaws of the Rotary Club of Greenville, at least one month prior to the Annual Meeting on December 13, 2016, we begin the process of electing leaders for 2017-2018. The President for 2017--2018 will be Scott Stephens who is serving as President-Elect during 2016-2017. The President-Elect for 2017-2018 is Russ Miller who is serving as Secretary during 2016-2017.

Nominations are being requested for the following positions of leadership:

Secretary- The secretary works closely with the Administrative Director in keeping records, reporting changes in attendance to the board, reviewing minutes, preparing the club directory, and performing other duties that pertain to the office of secretary. For succession planning, it is expected that the secretary would serve as president-elect the following year and as president after that if confirmed by the nominations committee.

Treasurer- The treasurer is responsible for the financial records and reporting for the Club. The treasurer works closely with the Administrative Director and the senior leadership of the club to develop an annual operating plan, to report monthly on the financial condition of the Club, to monthly reconcile the Club's bank statements and to complete the IRS 990 for the Club.

Five Directors – Directors serve a term of two years on the Rotary Club of Greenville Board of Directors and provide leadership for the Rotary areas of service and committees of the club.
