The Paul Harris Fellow Match



The Paul Harris Fellows program was established in 1957 to show appreciation for and encourage substantial contributions to what was then the Foundation's only program, Rotary Foundation Fellowships for Advanced Study, the precursor to Ambassadorial Scholarships. Early Paul Harris Fellows received a certificate of recognition. In 1969, the Foundation unveiled the first Paul Harris Fellow medallion created by Japanese metal artist Fiju Tsuda. Also in 1979, the Rotary International President-Elect James Bomar challenged each Rotary Club to make one non-Rotarian a Paul Harris Fellow.

The Rotary Club of Pikesville, Maryland, in 1980, responded by making a donation in the name of Mother Teresa. Many other notable figures have been named as Paul Harris Fellows, including U.S. President Jimmy Carter, Russian President Boris Yeltsin,

U.S. astronaut James Lovell, UN Secretary-General Javier Perez de Cuellar, and Jonas Salk.


