Please join us to hear Ted Pitts, the South Carolina Chamber of Commerce President & CEO, discuss the roads bill and the State Chamber's proposed solutions to the current legislative impasse.

Ted came to the Chamber after serving as Chief of Staff for South Carolina Governor Nikki Haley working for the Governor during her first term in office from 2011-2014. The Board is recommending a dues increase of \$3.00 per year and a meals increase of \$2.00 per meal. This is the first dues and meals increase in 3 years.

Rotary International and the District increase dues annually, so our Club has been subsidizing this for years. In addition, the cost of meals was increased in our last contract negotiation, and the Club has been subsidizing that difference.

We are facing a budget shortfall for other reasons, so the increases are critical to our Club's continued success and an investment in necessary improvements that will benefit our Club's future, like website and technological upgrades and additional resources for membership retention and development.

We will vote on this proposal at our May 24th Club meeting.
