Fundraising Committee: Concentrated commitment from now until November 1. Limited engagement from November 1 through February 28, 2018. We need two people to fill this committee.


Display Committee: Concentrated weekend commitment from September 1 through November 22 and from January 2 through February 28, 2018. We need four people to fill this committee.

Rotary Partnership for Literacy

Celebration of the Rotary Partnership for Literacy

The goal of Basic Education and Literacy, one of Rotary International's six areas of focus, is to strengthen the capacity of communities to support basic education and increase adult literacy. To help strengthen the capacity of the Greenville Literacy Association (GLA) to foster adult literacy, Rotary Clubs in the Greater Greenville Metro Area signed a Memorandum of Agreement to create the Rotary Partnership for Literacy on October 23, 2014. According to the agreement, Rotary Clubs would provide funding to GLA for a period of three years in amounts determined by each Rotary Club. Each club would encourage Rotarians to serve as volunteer tutors and one Rotary member would serve on the GLA Board. Judith Prince, Rotary Club of Greenville, served as chair of the partnership.



On July, 27, 2017, ten Rotary Clubs celebrated the end of the three-year partnership that had raised \$50,000 for the GLA. Clubs participating in the partnership are as follows: Rotary Club of Fountain Inn; Rotary Club of Greater Greer; Rotary Club of Greenville; Rotary Club of Greenville Breakfast; Rotary Club of Greenville East; Rotary Club of Greenville Evening; Rotary Club of Mauldin; Rotary Club of North Greenville; Rotary Club of Simpsonville; The Foothills Rotary Club.

Each Rotary Club was represented at the celebration, and each received a commemorative crystal with the name of the club, dates of the partnership, and a quote by Kofi Annan, "Literacy is a bridge from misery to hope." Jocelyn Slaughter, Executive Director of GLA and a member of the Rotary Club of Greenville, addressed the partnership members. Two GLA students spoke at the celebration and thanked the Rotary partners for their contributions to adult literacy. Lance Young, Rotary District 7750 Governor, thanked the Rotary Clubs for working together.

Based on needs identified by the GLA Executive Director, funds contributed over the three-year period by Rotary Club partners were used to purchase technology for GLA, fund GED and Quick Jobs Scholarships, and purchase materials for GED students. The Rotary Partnership for Literacy purchased the first smart boards used by GLA. Three Promethean Activ Panel Boards were purchased, one for each GLA Learning Center. A Communications Board was purchased for the lobby of GLA to provide information for students about classes and to recognize students' successes and graduations as well as recognize volunteer staff.



One of the greatest accomplishments of the Rotary Partnership for Literacy was the funding of many GED scholarships. GED students may be in low wage jobs and not employed at all, so paying \$150 to take the GED is not possible. Funding was provided for Aztec online seats for independent study for the GED, Rosetta Stone language resources for ESL students, and other materials.

Other outcomes for the Partnership included volunteering to "take down" GLA's Really Good, Really Big, Really Cheap Book Sale, volunteering to serve as mentors for GED and ESL students, and providing greater visibility and advocacy for adult literacy by offering programs on adult literacy in each Rotary Club.

In recognition of support for adult education programs at GLA by the Rotary Partnership for Literacy, Jocelyn Slaughter, Executive Director, announced that the Media Room at GLA will be named the Rotary Partnership for Literacy Media Room. A plaque with the names of Rotary Clubs who are partners is displayed outside the media room.

The Rotary Partnership for Literacy will receive the Greenville Literacy Association Community Service Award during the GLA Graduation and Awards ceremony on Tuesday, May 23, 2017. Lance Young, Rotary District 7750 Governor, will accept the award on behalf of the Rotary Partnership for Literacy.
