Rotary Donor Advised Funds

President Elect Barry Rassin of Nassau, Bahamas in our paired Zone 34 created the Hurricane Emergency Relief Donor Advised Fund (No. 296) to collect funds for all Rotary clubs and districts affected by hurricanes in the Caribbean and southeastern United States. This includes Puerto Rico. All Rotary clubs in those areas can apply for funds from the DAF advisory committee of Rotarian leaders and anyone may contribute to the fund.

There have also been funds set up specifically for Puerto Rico (No. 614); to help those affected by Hurricane Harvey (No. 608) and the Mexican Earthquakes (No. 613). These funds also have advisory committees who will evaluate projects from Rotary clubs and disburse funds. Please note: donations to these accounts will not receive TRF recognition.
