Craig McCoy is the Chief Executive Officer of Bon Secours St. Francis Health System in Greenville, South Carolina. This system encompasses St. Francis Downtown with 277 beds; the 93-bed St. Francis Eastside; the St. Francis Cancer Center; the Optimum Health Network; St. Francis Physician Services; and the Bon Secours St. Francis Health System Foundation.

Previous to his arrival at Bon Secours St. Francis on June 8, 2015, Mr. McCoy was with Emory Healthcare in Atlanta, Georgia, serving as Chief Executive Officer of Emory Saint Joseph's Hospital and Emory Johns Creek Hospital. He previously served as Chief Executive Officer at Paradise Valley Hospital in Phoenix, Arizona, and Vice President Professional Services at Oconee Medical Center in Seneca, South Carolina.

Mr. McCoy is a graduate of Furman University in Greenville, South Carolina and obtained his masters of health administration from Clemson/Medical University of South Carolina. He is a member of the American College of Healthcare Executives. Mr. McCoy also serves on the Board of Directors of the Greenville Chamber of Commerce, South Carolina Governor's School for Science & Math Foundation, University of Greenville, Peace Center for the Performing Arts, the Advisory Board of LiveWell Greenville and the Commerce Club Board of Governors.

HOLLY TREE COUNTRY CLUB

COURSE DESCRIPTION: Holly Tree Country Club's eighteen-hole golf course is laid out over rolling Foothills terrain. The course was designed by George Cobb and is a challenge from all sets of tees. The course plays 6,790 yards from the blue tees, 6,340 yards from the white tees, 5,901 yards from the grey tees, 5,01 yards from the gold tees, 5,184 yards from the red tees, and 4,812 from the black tees. Four beautiful lakes and Gilder Creek bring water into play on nine of the holes. The course features a double St. Andrews-style green serving holes 9 and 18. In addition to a driving range and putting green, Holly Tree Country Club also offers a separate chipping area and a short course practice area ideal for players of all ages and skill levels wishing to work on their game.
