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#### **Object of Rotary**

The object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

- The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;
- 2. High ethical standards in business and professions, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying by each Rotarian of his occupation as an opportunity to serve society;
- 3. The application of the ideal of service by every Rotarian to his or her personal, business and community life; and
- The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional men and women united in the ideal of service.

### The Four-Way Test

Encouraging high ethical standards and respect for all worthy vocations has been a hallmark of Rotary from its earliest days. In their business and professional lives, Rotarians abide by The Four-Way Test: Of the things we think, say or do:

- 1. Is it the TRUTH?
- 2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
- 3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
- 4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?

#### So What's Next?

Once you have completed the application (including two Sponsor's signatures), submit your completed application along with an updated resume to the Rotary office. You can mail or email the documents. Once the documents are received, the application will them be submitted to the Board of Directors for approval at the monthly Board meeting. Once the Board has approved the application your name will be published in the club bulletin as a proposed member for seven days. After seven days you will receive a "New Member Invitation Letter" along with an invoice. A schedule of prorated dues based on the month the Board of Directors approves your application for membership is to the right.

#### New Member "Fast Start" Plan

As a new member of our club, you will be issued a red Badge. This helps our established members easily identify, welcome, and assist you in a smooth introduction and acclimation to our club. When you have completed the tasks required on the Red to Blue checklist, you will be given a Blue Badge.

During your transition, you may request an Advisor if you so choose. This individual will introduce you to other members, be available to answer questions about our club, and help guide you in making decisions on the best ways for you to demonstrate "Service Above Self" throughout our organization.

It's common for new members to ask, "What now?" "How do I quickly take advantage of my membership and gain the benefits of being a Rotarian?" One of the first things you will do is attend the New Member Orientation. Many of the volunteer opportunities within our club will be introduced. We are currently in the planning process of an exciting new fundraiser, Camp the Falls. In collaboration with the City of Greenville Parks and Recreation, we will be highlighting the numerous outdoor adventures available to everyone in the Greenville area. Between a "Parks" based festival and a raffle for the community to win the chance to literally camp in Falls Park, we are instigating a fun and fundraising opportunity to showcase the best of the upstate. We will be asking all Rotarians to volunteer to be part of this inaugural fund-raising event. There's no better way to build relationships and become acclimated into our Club than working side-by-side with other Rotarians for a good cause.

Within the first 90 days, the opportunities to get involved are limitless from taking attendance at our lunch meetings, attending monthly Health & Happiness Hours, being a Greeter, exploring service-related activities, and joining a Club committee and much more!
